
CAUTION:

Store in a dry, well-ventilated area protected from rodents and insects. Do not feed moldy or insect-infested feed to animals as it may cause illness, performance loss or death. USE ONLY AS DIRECTED.

DIRECTIONS:

Feed with hay and/or pasture to make a complete ration for horses. Feed mature horses at the rate of 0.5 to 1 pound per 100 pounds body weight, along with 1 to 1.5 pounds of hay or equivalent pasture per 100 pounds body weight daily. After observing your horse for a period of time, you may want to increase or decrease the daily feeding to keep your horse in the desired condition. The amount required will vary, depending on the quality and amount of hay or pasture consumed. Do not feed more than 0.5 lbs per 100 lbs body weight of this product at a single feeding.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FEEDING HORSES: The recommended feeding rate should not be exceeded. Do not feed free-choice. Any feed changes should be made gradually over a period of 7 to 10 days. Changes in the rate of feeding should not exceed one pound per day for each horse. Feed at regular times, at least twice daily, with three daily feedings preferred.
